Historic Preservation and Rehabilitation

This Georgian Revival style building was designed by Chicago architects, Shattuck & Hussey, who were the sole designers of more than sixty Christian Association buildings. The new YWCA opened its doors on May 9, 1911 for a cost of \$125,000. The building served them until 1978. Prior to the current rehabilitation, the structure was last rehabilitated in 1982, when it was carefully restored and updated to bring it to full compliance as commercial space. The property is located adjacent to the Tennessee State Capitol, numerous, cultural attractions, hotels and restaurants, and within a ten minute walk to Broadway.


